The **Dawn Slade-Faull Award** aims to empower South Australian emerging artists with a disability by providing financial support and encouragement to help them realise their potential in their chosen medium.

The Award aims to be flexible and respond to the changing needs of artists and the community. In 2020, the year of COVID-19 and social distancing, the Award will open with an online **SALA** exhibition showcasing the shortlisted artworks in August 2020 on the <u>DSFA website</u>.

The exhibition will conclude with a single Award of up to \$3,000.

Entries may be made by, or on behalf of, any artist who is resident in South Australia and who has an intellectual, physical, psychiatric, cognitive or sensory disability.
